- ◆ Welcome dinner at the local restaurant located in the Old Town.
- ◆ Overnight at hotel.

Day 2 (B, L) Warsaw

- ◆ Half day guided sightseeing tour of Warsaw including: Lazienki Royal Park – the beautiful park-and-palace complex, Old Town of Warsaw – monumental reconstruction of city's best times' appearance from 17th and 18th centuries; documentary movie about dramatic history of the city at the Historical Museum of Warsaw; the monument to Ghetto Uprising Heroes within the former Jewish Ghetto area; Wilanow Palace – called „Polish Versailles” with splendid art gallery and French garden around.

- ◆ Excursion to Masovian countryside to see: Zelazowa Wola – a birthplace of Frederick Chopin, where visit to the manor where the composer was born is followed by private piano recital; private Crafts Museum by Julian Brzozowski.

Malbork – Teutonic Castle

Celebrate the Second Millennium of Christianity

(7 days & 6 nights)

The Christianity in Poland dates back to as early as the year 966, when the ruler of the Polanie tribe, Mieszko I was baptised into the Christian faith. Since then Poland, over the centuries Catholicism has been the national and most important religion, strongly tied with national tradition and the symbol of Polish national identity.

Karol Wojtyla, now known as John Paul II, was the archbishop of Cracow till 1978.

In the country you will find thousands of churches and shrines, the pilgrimage centres, where during big church holidays you can see many old, beautiful religious rituals coloured with regional nuances.

Our programme presents only few of many of these places, although all of them are really worth seeing as the eternal treasury of over thousand years of devotion to old and beautiful customs.

Day 1 (L, D) Cracow

- ◆ Arrival in the Cracow airport. Meet your fully licensed guide assistant and transfer to hotel.
- ◆ Guided sightseeing tour of Cracow including: St. Mary's Church; Market Square; Collegium Maius; The Archbishop's Palace - former seat of Karol Wojtyla; Wawel Cathedral - the ancient royal sanctuary the crypt of St. Leonard; royal tombstones, mausoleum of St. Stanislaus who was killed in the Church on the Hill; Bernardine Church with picture of the Mother of Consolation from Sokal; Carmelite Church of the Visitation „Na Piasku” with marvellous picture of the Mother of God with Child.
- ◆ Lunch at local restaurant.
- ◆ Transfer to Lagiewniki, where you will visit the Congregation of Sisters of the Divine Mother of Mercy with the tomb of Blessed Sister Faustyna who worked and died here celebrate the mass.

Day 2 (B, L, D) Wadowice, Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, Piekary Slaskie, Czestochowa

- ◆ Drive to Wadowice, the birthplace of Pope John Paul II. Visit to the Museum of His Holiness in Wadowice followed by mass at the local parish church.
- ◆ Lunch at local restaurant.



- ◆ Transfer to Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, the oldest and the most famous Way of the Cross in Poland nearby Bernardine Monastery and Baroque church of Our Lady of the Angels with silver figure of the Virgin and miraculous picture of the Weeping Madonna.
- ◆ Drive to Czestochowa.

- ◆ Stop in Piekary Slaskie, visit to the Calvary, the place of cult of the Virgin of Piekary - miraculous picture famous for its properties in saving many people from the Black Death.
- ◆ Dinner and overnight at hotel in Czestochowa.

Day 3 (B, D) Czestochowa, Lichen

- ◆ Breakfast at hotel.
- ◆ Visit to the Pauline Monastery at Jasna Gora, home to the holiest relic in Poland - the wooden painted Byzantine icon of Black Madonna; the 5th world pilgrimage centre after Varanosi, Mecca, Lourdes and Rome. See the Chapel of Miraculous Picture, Gothic Basilica, Knights' Hall, Treasury, 600th Anniversary Museum.
- ◆ Celebrate the mass.
- ◆ Drive to Lichen.
- ◆ Dinner and overnight at hotel in Lichen.

Day 4 (B, D) Lichen, Glogowiec, Plock

- ◆ Breakfast at hotel.
- ◆ Visit to the shrine of the Queen of Poland of the Dolours on the hill; see the miraculous icon of Virgin Mary with a white eagle on her breast; nearby Golgotha and the biggest church in Europe (seating 7,000), blessed by Pope John Paul II during his last visit to Poland in 1999, constructed to commemorate the 2000th anniversary of the birth of Christ.
- ◆ Celebrate the mass.
- ◆ Drive to Glogowiec to see the birthplace of Blessed Sister Faustina.
- ◆ Transfer to Plock.
- ◆ Dinner and overnight at hotel in Plock.

Day 5 (B, L, D) Plock, Niepokalanow

- ◆ Breakfast at hotel.
- ◆ Visit to the first place of appearance of appearance of Merciful Jesus to Blessed Sister Faustina.
- ◆ Celebrate the mass.
- ◆ Drive to Niepokalanow, one of the youngest sanctuaries in Poland, Franciscan monastery founded by St. Maksymilian Kolbe who gave his life in a voluntary sacrifice for the life of one's of his fellow prisoners in Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp and was canonised in 1982.
- ◆ Lunch at local restaurant.
- ◆ Arrival in Warsaw.
- ◆ Celebrate mass at St. Stanislaus Kostka Church, the parish church where „chaplains of Solidarity” - father Popielusko served where now pilgrims come to pay homage at his graveside.

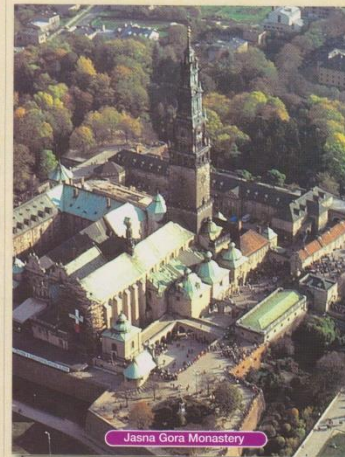

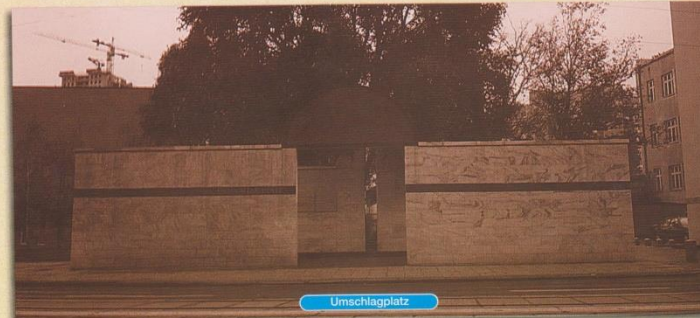

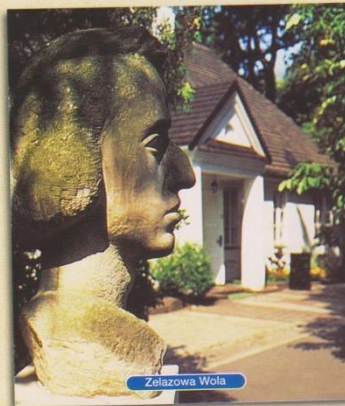

founded in 1364 year, now museum displaying among old astronomic instruments and alchemy equipment the globe from 1510 year with the American continent, marked for the first time in history.

Dinner and classic music concert by violin quartet at Fontana Room of „Pod Gruszka” restaurant, a zero class monument, Gothic walls with Baroque stuccoes.

- ◆ Excursion to Wieliczka Salt Mine, over 700 years old salt mine with underground chapels and chambers entirely wrought in salt accessible to visitors.

Farms and Breedings in Poland

(6 days & 5 nights)

Most of the country is granary. Agriculture in Poland, like in no other former communist country, was after World War II based mainly on small private farms. Collective farms, so called PGR, occupied only about 2% of the arable territory. The main agricultural crops from the fields stretching through the low lying plains from the east to the west of the country are: rye, wheat, sugar beet, barley and oats.

Poland is one of very few countries in Europe where you can see traditionally cultivated fields and quite villages with old, rural architecture as well as modern specialist farms and breedings.

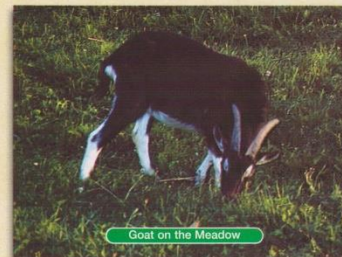

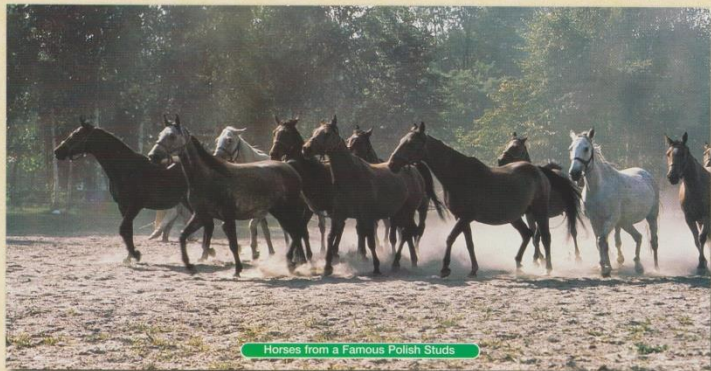
